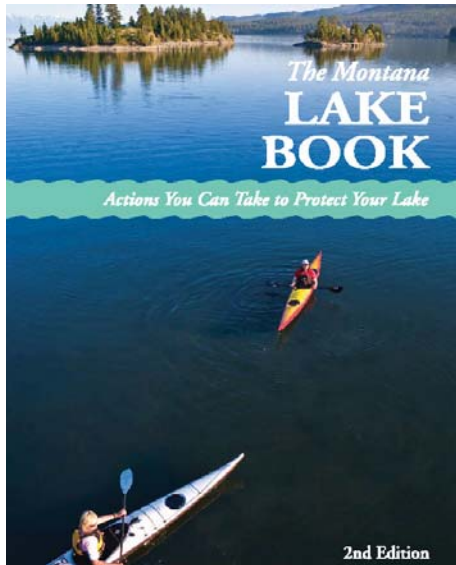


10,000 copies of the Montana Lake Book (2nd Edition) rolled off the presses in March.

Project co-coordinator John Wachsmuth of Montana FWP said that all 10,000 copies of the first edition had been distributed over a ten year period.

“The first edition of the Montana Lake Book was so well received by lake homeowners, lake users, and others who are interested in keeping Montana’s lakes special that we needed to update it and produce a 2nd edition” Wachsmuth said.



Project co-coordinator Mike Koopal of the Whitefish Lake Institute said, “it was time to update the publication to include new information about emerging water quality issues and to add new resource contact information.”

The second edition of the Montana Lake Book has a wide array of informational content regarding smart land use that we can all employ to protect water quality. The publication also details how we can protect our water quality and economy from the threat of Aquatic Invasive

Species such as zebra mussels.

Koopal said the publication is the result of a collaborative effort between representatives from Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks, Montana DEQ, Montana DNRC, Flathead County, Lake County, Flathead National Forest, Flathead Basin Commission, Flathead Conservation District, Flathead Lake Biological Station, Flathead Lakers, Whitefish School District, and the Whitefish Lake Institute.

Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program

The Whitefish to Eureka Volunteer water monitoring program is joining forces with the Flathead Basin Commission's Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program (VLMP) and has formed the Northwest Volunteer Monitoring Network. The creation of the monitoring network allows both programs to keep their own identity but also work together and be consistent with monitoring parameters across northwestern Montana lakes. There are 50+ lake monitoring sites located in Lincoln, Flathead, Lake and Missoula counties. The emphasis of the program will be to monitor water quality and to educate volunteers about Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) early detection and prevention.

The VLMP was initiated in 1993 by the Flathead Basin Commission as a way to enable local residents an opportunity to collect baseline data on water quality of lakes in Flathead, Lake and Missoula counties. The Whitefish to Eureka program, established in 2007, was designed based on the VLMP model. Lake selection for both programs was based upon public use, accessibility and susceptibility to AIS.

Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks Region 1, Flathead Basin Commission and the Whitefish Lake Institute are in cooperative partnership to keep volunteer lake monitoring for northwest Montana in existence for generations to come. Volunteers are generally the first responders to an AIS sighting so the importance of a volunteer monitoring program is as important as ever. Jim Berry and the Whitefish Community Foundation breathe new life into Research Vessel

In 2009, WLI received a \$5,000 grant from the Whitefish Community Foundation to purchase a new motor for our research vessel "Mayfly." The new motor will certainly add a margin of safety when working in foul weather, allowing us to get off the lake quickly if necessary. It will also enable us to move more quickly from site to site, increasing our daily productivity.

The new motor is a 60 hp Evinrude E-Tech. As a fuel injected two-stroke it is the cleanest, quietest, and most fuel efficient motor available. WLI is attempting to set the standard for minimizing fuel based contaminants and noise pollution on our lake.

In order to mount the new motor on the "old boat" we contacted Jim Berry of Mobile Marine Services. Many of you know Jim as the do-all, fix-all boat guy that winterizes boats for Can Am Motors and services all types of water craft at his shop in Kalispell. Jim grew up on the lake, studied small engines while attending Whitefish High School, and worked on generators and all types of equipment at Midway Rental. Jim was a participant in the Whitefish Lake Regatta years back where he began his interest in servicing marine power plants. He still keeps a boat on the lake in Monks Bay and is deeply concerned about the future of water quality. In his words, "Somebody has to keep an eye on this. I care deeply about the lake. It's my home and I want to see it taken care of so that my kids can enjoy it in the future." When asked what we owed him for the retrofit he said... "You don't owe me a thing. I just want to see someone take care of that lake and that you guys are out there doing it. This is my way of helping to meet that goal."

WLI is deeply appreciative of Jim's donation of nearly forty hours of labor and many dollars worth of parts and pieces to help keep us up and running. -CR
