#### **Eurasion Watermilfoil found in Beaver Lake**

Eurasian watermilfoil (EWM)—an aquatic invasive weed—was found in Beaver Lake near Whitefish on October 19th during a Department of Natural Resources & Conservation field trip. A lengthy lake survey was then conducted by Flathead Basin Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Workgroup consultant, Erik Hanson, and Whitefish Lake Institute environmental scientist Josh Gubits who together concluded the area covers at least 12 square feet near the boat dock. Positive identification was confirmed by Montana Fish Wildlife & Parks and the Montana Department of Agriculture.

#### **Boat Ramp Closure & Clean-up Effort**

The boat ramp at Beaver Lake has been closed in an effort to protect a spread of the weed on Beaver Lake and to other Northwest Montana Lakes. Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks announced that the closure will remain in effect until EWM plants and floating fragments have been removed.

#### **Eurasian Watermilfoil**

EWM was introduced to North America from Europe and Asia, and is found over much of the United States. Lakes with EWM can experience steep declines in fisheries, dissolved oxygen depletion, decreases in property values and the loss of recreational use.

EWM reproduces successfully and very rapidly, making it a threat to any water body it invades. It forms dense mats of vegetation on the surface of the water, interfering with recreational activities such as fishing, swimming, and boating. Because its spring growth starts earlier than most native plants, it can stop sunlight from reaching native plants, causing the decline of native species. In the fall and late summer, the plant becomes brittle and breaks into fragments, which float across lakes, sinking and starting new plants. Plant pieces are easily

transported between water bodies by boats and fishing gear.
Once established, this plant is very expensive to control.
Idaho has spent \$9 million dollars over the last several years controlling EWM in its waters. (*continued on page 2*)

# (EWM continued from page 1) Halting the Spread

Recreationists are asked to help stop the spread of invasive species by always properly washing their boats and fishing equipment. Anyone who has fished or boated on Beaver Lake should clean their boats, equipment, and waders prior to entering another water body. If non-decontaminated equipment was taken from Beaver Lake to any other lake, please contact Montana Fish Wildlife and Parks (FWP) at 406.444.2449 so those locations can be monitored. FWP has a decontamination station and a brochure listing approved carwashes.

#### A Threat to Whitefish Lake

The Whitefish Lake Institute and the Flathead Basin Aquatic Invasive Species Workgroup have not found any evidence of EWM in Whitefish Lake during routine surveys and after an extensive survey this fall. WLI is concerned about the proximity of the Beaver Lake EWM infestation to Whitefish Lake. All boat owners need to become familiar with this issue to prevent the spread of this weed.

#### Flathead Aquatic Invasive Species Workgroup

The mission of the Flathead Basin AIS Workgroup is to work locally to help prevent the introduction of aquatic invasive species into the Flathead Basin, and to help contain, control and, where possible, eradicate the aquatic invasive species present in the Flathead Basin. Members include: City of Polson, Clark Fork Coalition, Clearwater Resource Council, Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes, Flathead Basin Commission, Flathead Conservation District, Flathead County, Flathead County Weed District, Flathead Lakers, Flathead Lake Biological Station, Glacier National Park, Lake County, Missoula County/Missoula County Weed District, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks, Montana Department of Agriculture, Salish Kootenai College, Sanders County, Swan Lakers, US Fish & Wildlife Service, US Forest Service, US Geological Survey, Whitefish Lake Institute, and select Flathead County legislators.



Thanks to all of the hardworking and dedicated volunteers, the Northwest Montana Lakes Volunteer Monitoring Network 2011 field season was a great success! Forty six volunteers throughout the region participated in water quality data collection on the forty two program lakes. Volunteers spent more than 800 hours in the field collecting water data and searching for aquatic invasive species.

The newest feature to the NWMTLVMN is the program website and online database. Over 270 data forms were submitted through the new website, and the public is using it to find information on aquatic invasive species. # **Fall Education Programs**

As Lori and I fired up the WLI truck at 5:00 am we wondered where we would collect bugs for a presentation later that morning at Somers Elementary School. After some caffeine and a little deliberation, we decided our first stop for bug collection would be on the Flathead River. When we arrived, still dark and bitter cold, I reluctantly slid on the waders and crept into the river. I could just barely make out where my next step would be, and would have been totally lost if not for the headlights from the truck to help guide my way.

Lori and I did manage to get quite the assortment of aquatic macroinvertebrates "bugs" which included caddisflies, mayflies, midges, worms, scuds and a few other neat critters that cruised the spoons of the students observing them. In addition to teaching a bug lesson at Somers, WLI staff taught five classes at Whitefish High School and more than 120 second graders at Muldown Elementary School. WLI offers educational programs to all age groups and explores concepts relative to clean water and watershed dynamics through water chemistry and biology. -JG

## **WLI Receives Whitefish Community Foundation Grants**

At the November Whitefish Community Foundation Grants Awards Ceremony, WLI received grants from the Whitefish Community Foundation Community Grants Fund, the Kramer Family Fund, and the Whitefish Mountain Resort Fund.

Between the Foundation's grant program and another \$193,000 from donor advised funds, over \$300,000 was distributed at the awards ceremony, a 20% increase over 2010. In total, 137 grants were awarded to 75 different non-profit organizations that are either Whitefish based or provide services to the Whitefish Community.
